RESEARCH OVERVIEW

Aim: Explore and develop innovative housing solutions for young people in Swansea.

Empirical Objectives:

- Examine the experiences of young people within a range of tenure settings.
- Investigate the opportunities and constraints faced by individuals in accessing and sustaining accommodation, both in temporary and long-term housing.

Conceptual Objectives:

• Explore the efforts to develop housing to prevent homelessness and support homeless young people.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Development of the transitional framework of a young person's homelessness journey in Swansea.
- Different stages seek policy and practice recommendations alongside current good practice.
- Prevention/ Process/ Housing/ Support



Framework: A young person's homelessness journey

Early intervention and Prevention:

- Limited knowledge and support within educational institutes.
- Lack of family and relationship support at earlier stages pre-homelessness.
- High levels of mental health and substance misuse.

Recommendations:

- Up-streaming
- Information through education.
- Pre-crisis mediation.
- Specialist substance misuse and mental health support for families.

Phase 1



First point of call:

- Accessibility and Communication.
- Criteria for housing and support.
- Limited interim accommodation.

Recommendations:

- Youth Homelessness Charter.
- Information outlets.
- Training.
- Emergency interim accommodation.

Phase 2



Housing for All:

- Substandard accommodation across sector.
- Safety.
- Affordability.
- Lack of 'home'.

Recommendations:

- Co-operative approach to housing.
- Shared housing options and guidance.
- Housemate and education.
- Housing First Principles.
- Pre-tenancy support and development of 'home'.

Phase 3



Guidance and Support:

- Limited personalisation of support.
- Continuity of support staff.
- Knowledge of housing and welfare rights and entitlements.

Recommendations:

- Personalised approach and Psychologically Informed Environment.
- Recognition of staff.
- The inclusion of the rights and entitlements of young people in the Youth Homelessness Charter.
