Welcome to our Annual Report for 2017-18. This has been an exciting year for WCVA and we've led some significant changes.

2017-18 marked the beginning of our new five-year strategic plan, following extensive consultation and discussions with our members and partners. Over the next few pages you'll see a snapshot of what we've been doing to realise our ambitious new goals, focusing on the change we want to see both in society and within our organisation.

Our strategic plan considers how WCVA contributes to the Well-being Goals set out in the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act. It's clear to us that the third sector's contribution to achieving the Well-being Goals, and future prosperity in Wales, is vital.

However, the third sector in Wales is facing unprecedented change and increasing

challenges, including rising demand, tightening resources and uncertainty. WCVA is here to provide support, challenge, and leadership for the sector and we take this very seriously.

In 2017-18 we distributed £9,795,552 to the third sector to help support sustainable funding. We engaged with our members, partners and government to identify what needs to happen if we are to achieve more empowered and resilient communities in Wales. We also connected over 500 third sector employees and volunteers to learn from and inspire each other as part of our annual gofod³ event.

We are proud to be a member of Third Sector Support Wales, a unique network of support organisations for the third sector in Wales,

and through this work closely with the 19 County Voluntary Councils who play a key role in supporting the third sector locally.

Very little of what we do happens with just one person or agency involved, and working in partnership, collaborating and engaging with our members is at the heart of how WCVA staff deliver challenging and stretching targets. This year we are delighted to have progressed a partnership with Cynnal Cymru, the leading organisation for sustainable development in Wales, a relationship with great potential for the future.

The impact of the third sector and volunteers is incredible and we are extremely grateful to all WCVA's staff and our Board for their ongoing work and commitment to support it.







Dechreuodd Joshua weithio gydag ELITE Paper Solutions fis Ebrill 2017 fel Gweithiwr Ailgylchu dan Hyfforddiant. Ers hynny mae ef wedi cwblhau hyfforddiant codi a chario a Rhaglen Hyfforddeiaeth ac yn symud ymlaen at Brentisiaeth Sylfaen mewn Gweithrediadau Warws. Sustainable funding is key to a stronger and more resilient third sector. Here's how it has helped ELITE Paper Solutions to support Joshua.

WCVA's investment in ELITE Paper Solutions through the Social Business Growth Fund has helped Joshua O'Leary with issues around weight, dexterity, dyslexia and depression.

Joshua began work at ELITE in April 2017 as a Trainee Recycling Operative. Since then he has completed manual handling training and a Traineeship Programme and is progressing to a Foundation Apprenticeship in Warehousing. He was nominated for the Wales Apprenticeship Awards and won the People's Plus Traineeship of the Year Level One Award. He said: 'This environment has helped build my confidence. I have made loads of new friends which I couldn't do before.'



Mae FuZe, sy'n fwya dim ond lle chwarae meddal i blant, nid yn unig yn darparu swyddi yn y gymuned – a gwasanaethau amrywiol – ond hefyd yn gwneud arian hollbwysig sy'n cael ei ailfuddsoddi yn amcanion cymdeithasol yr elusen.

Yn sgil llwyddiant y prosiect (sydd wedi creu 8.6 swydd gyfwerth ag amser llawn) mae Fern Partnership nawr yn bwiriadu parhau i dyfu a dod yn fudiad angori cymunedol, gan ddarparu a hwylus o gwasanaethau hanfodol i'r gymuned.

'Rydym wrth ein boddau â datblygiad y mudiad yn y tair blynedd diwethaf a'r twf sylweddol sydd wedi bod o ran creu swyddi a'r gwasanaethau rydym yn eu cynnig i'r gymuned,' meddai'r Rheolwr-Gyfarwyddwr Michelle Coburn-Hughes.

'Rydym ar y trywydd iawn i greu 55 swydd erbyn Medi 2019 ac mae hyn oll wedi bod yn bosib diolch i dim staff rhagorol, arweinwyr brwdfrydig ac ysbrydoledig a chymorth gan fudiadau fel WCVA.'

CREATING MORE EMPOWERED COMMUNITIES

Funding from WCVA is helping the Fern Partnership improve well-being in their community.

Using funding from WCVA's Social Business Growth Fund, and with loan finance through our Communities Investment Fund, the Fern Partnership has acquired a children's play centre based in Clydach in the Rhondda which has been refurbished and turned into a social enterprise.

FuZe, which is more than just soft play for children, is not only providing jobs in the community - and a range of services - but also bringing in vital funds to be reinvested in the social aims of the charity.

With the success of the project (having created the full time equivalent of 8.6 jobs) the Fern Partnership now plans to continue to grow and become a community anchor organisation, delivering and facilitating vital services for the community.

'We are delighted with the progress the organisation has made within the last three years which has seen a substantial growth in job creation and the services we offer the community,' said Managing Director Michelle Coburn-Hughes.

'We are on target to create 55 jobs by September 2019 and all this possible due to a team of outstanding staff, inspirational and passionate leaders and support from organisations such as WCVA.'

Arweiniodd y gwaith hwn at adroddiad 'Grymuso Cymunedau', sy'n amlinellu chwe egwyddor i rymuso cymunedau a ddisgrifiwyd gan Ysgrifennydd y Cabinet dros Lywodraeth Leol a Gwasanaethau Cyhoeddus fel 'tystiolaeth a syniadau defnyddiol ac amserol'.

Byddwn yn parhau i weithio gyda'r sector a Llywodraeth Cymru yn y maes hwn drwy gydol 2018-19.

INFORMING THINKING AND INFLUENCING ACTION

We explored how resilient communities can improve well-being.

- We engaged with the third sector to spark debate on the issues using a variety of different platforms including events, online discussion, vlogs, blogs and podcasts
- We worked with sector think tank Talwrn to make sure our discussions were informed by evidence
- 64 representatives of public, private and business sectors contributed to our report with Carnegie UK Trust, 'Supporting Local Places and Local People'. Focusing on towns in Wales the report made a number of recommendations to all sectors and Welsh Government

This activity led to 'Empowering Communities', a report outlining six principles to create empowered communities described by the Cabinet Secretary for Local Government and Public Services as 'a useful and timely piece of evidence and thinking'.

We'll continue to work with the sector and Welsh Government in this area throughout 2018-19.

READY TO MEASURE OUR IMPACT

Working in partnership and sharing resources is vital for sustainability.

We have spent much of this year working with Third Sector Support Wales (TSSW) partners on ways to improve how we demonstrate the impact of the third sector support infrastructure – WCVA and the County Voluntary Councils.

A new Customer Relation Management (CRM) system will be implemented in 2018 to record all interactions between TSSW and the third sector; an Influencing Tracker will catalogue the ways in which the third sector has influenced decision-makers in Wales, and a survey will be sent out to all members of TSSW bodies asking them their opinions on the work we do. In this way we hope to be able to present a full picture to the public, the National Assembly and the sector of the substantial impact of the work of TSSW.

CHARTING A COURSE FOR STRONGER TIES WITH MEMBERS

We have committed to making better use of our biggest resource, our members.

This year we have rejuvenated our commitment to our members by launching a new Membership Charter. The Charter commits to involving members in all our work; facilitating conversations across the third sector; testing new ideas and ways of working; and being open and inclusive. It also encourages members to support our vision of a third sector that improves well-being for all, to provide feedback on how we work, and to share ideas and knowledge.

The Charter was signed at our Annual General Meeting in Llandudno in November. CAIS Chief Executive Clive Wolfendale co-signed the Charter along with our Chief Executive, Ruth Marks. Clive was pleased to commit CAIS to the Charter's aims and said: 'It was a great honour to sign this membership charter on behalf of the whole of the third sector in Wales.'


As at 31 March 2018, the Charity held unrestricted reserves of £4,057,738. A further £3,832,124 was held as restricted reserves, being funding received to carry out specific projects and activity.

The trustees will seek to ensure that a financial strategy of prudence and care is pursued to ensure both the safeguarding of the charity's unrestricted reserves and the appropriate financial management of project finances to support the ongoing financial sustainability of the Charity.

The Annual Accounts were approved on 23 August 2018 and have been delivered to the Charity Commission and the Registrar of Companies. The accounts have been audited by a Statutory Auditor, Grant Thornton UK LLP, who has issued unqualified opinion on the full annual financial statements and on the consistency of the trustees' report with those annual financial statements. Their report on the full annual financial statements contained no statement under sections 498(2) and 498(3) of the Companies Act 2006.


ARIAN A DDOSBARTHWYD I'R SECTOR MONEY DISTRIBUTED TO THE SECTOR




ADNODDAU I MEWN


ADNODDAU A WARIWYD
